GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP FOR LONG-TERM SUCCESS

NGC was organized to coordinate activities for State Garden Clubs along with similar groups outside of the U.S.. As mentioned above, NGC provides education, resources and networking for members. NGC's mission is fulfilled through three major programs:

- 1. Gardening Promotion and Membership
- 2. Gardening Education and the Schools
- 3. The National Gardener magazine and other publications.

NGC operations are coordinated by a staff of six employees at its headquarters and some assistance from volunteers. The NGC Federation consists of eight regions comprised of geographically contiguous state garden clubs which are composed of District groupings of individual community garden clubs. Various meetings, events, and mission-related activities take place at each level of this garden club structure.

OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS

NGC's governance structure consists of the Board of Directors; on this board are elected officers (President, VP, 2nd VP, 3rd VP), regional directors, state presidents, a parliamentarian, historian, corresponding secretary, a PH&E Director and Trustees, and committee chairmen and members.

PRESIDENT BRENDA MOORE



Brenda Moore is NGC's current and 48th president. The theme for her 2023-2025 administration is "**GO GREEN - PLANT AMERICA**".

President Brenda Moore has made many accomplishments during her time with NGC, President Moore has written children's books and has established multiple programs, projects, and more. PRESIDENT'S PROJECTS

NGC President Brenda Moore's Project during her administration is "**PLANT AMERICA - Feed America**", which is a campaign to help feed the hungry across America. The project will encourage every NGC member to participate in one of several ways to help fight food insecurity. Since kicking off this project, over 120 individuals and garden clubs have donated. President Moore also created a <u>Wildlife Habitat Certification Program</u> and a <u>Pollinator Garden Certification Program</u> to encourage others to make changes to their gardens in order to better support wildlife. Over 300 applications have already been submitted since the program kicked off in September of 2023.



PLANT AMERICA began in 2017 under the leadership of former NGC President Nancy Hargroves. NGC's focus on community centered projects and efforts brings life to PLANT AMERICA.

PLANT AMERICA Month was initiated by former NGC President Mary Warshauer in April of 2021.

PLANT AMERICA MONTH incorporates the celebration of Arbor Day (the last Friday of April) and Earth Day (April 22).

NGC AWARDS

NGC recognizes the valuable work and performance of our members, clubs, and organizations throughout the year. The number of award categories that can be applied for are 35 adult awards and 10 youth award. NGC appreciates their accomplishments in making our world a better place.





AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

The Award of Excellence is the highest award presented to a Non-NGC member and is sponsored by a State Garden Club organization. It may be awarded to an individual, organization, or institution that has made a significant contribution toward the advancement of the goals and purposes of NGC

A Region or State Garden Club may apply for the Award of Excellence for its distinguished work on a coordinated activity or project *(in accordance with NGC's goals and objectives).* If a region applies, then each state in that region must participate.



FINANCIAL SECURITY

MULTIPLIER EFFECT



NGC's financial statements do not fully convey in monetary terms the impact that its programs and activities have through its volunteer members.

For example, NGC "PLANT AMERICA" grants are awarded to various clubs for local projects throughout the US. These grant projects are undertaken by garden club members, often in collaboration with other organizations and include additional funding raised by the local clubs. Often other NGC sponsor organizations (e.g., Ames Tools, Espoma garden products, etc.) will provide additional grants for these local projects. As a result, the "multiplier' effect of NGC "PLANT AMERICA" grants, when combined with volunteer labor and other funding sources, produces actual betterment to communities, which has a value far in excess of the monetary amounts reflected in

NGC's financial statements.

2021-2022 AUDIT REPORT



Fiscal Year: June 1, 2021 – May 31, 2022

Financial statements for the year ended May 31, 2022 were audited by Wipfli LLC, an independent CPA firm. They gave NGC an unqualified opinion, otherwise known as a clean report, which states that NGC's financial statements were presented fairly, in all material respects for the year (ending May 31, 2022).
